ORIGINS OF THE TERM

ANCIENT STORY

GREEK POET HOMER 8TH CENTURY BC

STORY OF KING ODYSSEUS WHO LEFT HIS SON,
TELEMACHUS, IN THE CARE OF HIS FRIEND NAMED
MENTOR

MENTOR INTERACTED WITH THE PRINCE IN A WAY THAT HELPED HIM GROW INTO THE SORT OF PERSON OF WHOM HIS FATHER WOULD APPROVE. MENTOR WAS NOT A TUTOR IN THE CLASSIC GREEK SENSE, NOR DID HE PROVIDE TECHNICAL TRAINING, BUT ACTED AS A GUIDE, CONVERSATION PARTNER, ADVOCATE AND ENCOURAGER.



CONNECTION IN MODERN USAGE

François Fénelon <u>The Adventures of Telemachus</u>, 1699

WRITTEN IN RESPONSE TO HIS TASK TO OVERSEE THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE HEIR TO THE FRENCH THRONE

IN FÉNELON'S WORK WE FIND THE FIRST RECORDED USE OF THE WORD 'MENTOR' IN THE MODERN SENSE.



CONNECTION IN MODERN USAGE

In the 18th, 19th and early 20th Centuries, the term "Mentor" Gained Currency among the intellectual elite





THE CELTIC TRADITION

- CELTIC CHRISTIANITY 'ANYONE WITHOUT A SOUL FRIEND IS LIKE A BODY WITHOUT A HEAD. EAT NO MORE UNTIL YOU GET A SOUL FRIEND.' (BRIGIT OF KILDARE)
- DIFFERENT ASSUMPTIONS AROUND SPIRITUALITY AND FORMATION THAN GRAECO-ROMAN ASSUMPTIONS
- 'ANAMCARA' SPIRITUAL SOUL FRIEND
- EVERYDAY, WHOLE OF LIFE AGENDA.

- CHRISTIAN MENTORING HAS BEEN SHAPED BY THE INTENTIONAL ONE-TO-ONE DISCIPLESHIP STYLE RELATIONSHIPS CULTIVATED WITHIN THESE MOVEMENTS



BIBLICAL BASIS FOR MENTORING

'MENTORING' IS NOT A BIBLICAL WORD, BUT IT DOES DESCRIBE A BIBLICAL REALITY.

THE BIBLICAL TERMS MOST CLOSELY RELATED TO MENTORING ARE:

- μαθητεύσατε MATHETEUSATE 'MAKE DISCIPLES' (MATT 28:19)
- καταρτισμός ΚΑΤΑRTISMOS 'PREPARE' OR 'EQUIP' (EPH 4:12)
- ποιμαίνω POIMAINO 'TEND AS A SHEPHERD' (1 PET 5:2)
- VOUθετεῖν NOUTHETEIN 'EDIFY' OR 'ADMONISH' (ROM 15:14)

- ONTOLOGICAL CONCERNED FOR BEING AS A FOUNDATION FOR DOING MT 28:19-20; EPH 4:12-13
- INCARNATIONAL REQUIRING AN ASPECT OF MODELLING PHIL 3:17; 4:9; 1 COR 4:15-16; 11:1; 2 TH 3:9
- LIBERATING REFUSING TO DOMINATE 2 TH 3:8; 1 PET 5:2-3
- GENERATIVE RECEIVERS PASS IT ON 1 TH 1:6-7; 2 TIM 2:2
- CHRISTOCENTRIC FORMATION AIMED AT CHRISTLIKENESS GAL 4:19; COL 1:28-29

WHO NEEDS A MENTOR?

MENTORING AS A FORMATIONAL PROCESS

- THE ETYMOLOGY OF 'MENTORING' ROOTED IN THE ANCIENT HOMERIC STORY SUGGESTS THAT MENTORING IS FUNDAMENTALLY CONCERNED WITH THE FORMATION OF A PERSON.
- THE EMPHASIS NOT SO MUCH ON KNOWLEDGE OR SKILLS BUT ON A PERSON'S INNER NATURE AND THE WAY THEIR CHARACTER UTILISES THE KNOWLEDGE AND SKILLS THEY POSSESS.
- THIS IS WORKED OUT IN PROFESSIONAL CAREER SETTINGS; MENTORING
 IS PROVIDED FOR TEACHERS, MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS,
 PSYCHOLOGISTS, SOLICITORS, MILITARY OFFICERS AND MANY OTHER
 PROFESSIONALS.
- This practice is based on the understanding that graduation from a course does not complete a person's preparation for operating in their chosen field.

- BECAUSE MENTORING RELATES TO THE FORMATION OF A PERSON, ITS APPLICABILITY FOR YOUNGER PEOPLE IS OBVIOUS.
- ONCE A PERSON'S FORMATION IS COMPLETE THEN THE NEED FOR MENTORING DROPS AWAY. BUT WHEN IS THAT POINT REACHED?
- IF WE CONSIDER FORMATION AS A PERSON, AS A DISCIPLE OF CHRIST AND AS A LEADER IS AN ON-GOING, LIFELONG ENTERPRISE THEN MENTORING WILL CONTINUE TO HAVE APPLICABILITY IN DIFFERENT WAYS THROUGHOUT LIFE EVEN INTO OUR OLDER YEARS.




